AIL, Mohali has always believed that mooting affords the participants the opportunity to decipher substantive legal problems while giving them an insight into the practical and theoretical aspects of law. With this objective in mind, Army Institute of Law, Mohali collaborated with Surana and Surana International Attorneys, for the first edition of this National Family Law Moot Court Competition which was held in 2019.

This competition is known for its avant-garde moot propositions and this year the proposition was based on multiple facets of personal laws, marriage laws and custody of a child. Over 50 teams from across the country, comprising some of the National Law Universities and prominent Law Schools applied for the competition; out of which 40 teams were registered on the first come first register basis. These teams were judged by India's top legal minds and professionals who specialise in the nuanced field of Family Law and Constitutional

Law. The Moot was inaugurated on Thursday, 8th April 2021. All the teams, comprising two/three teammates each, submitted their Memorial drafts and Pre-recorded videos, by 26th March and 30th March, respectively. It was vividly evident from the submissions that the teams had worked really hard to showcase their advocacy skills. On 8th April, the day came for which all the teams were excited, as the teams which were to advance their way from Preliminary rounds to Octa-final rounds were announced. The Octa-finals and Quarter-finals took place on 9th April. On 10th April, the semi-finals and finals were conducted. The teams battling out in the finals were D.E.S. Shri Navalmal Firodia Law College and V.I.T. School of Law, V.I.T. Chennai.

The honourable judges for the final rounds were Justice Rajiv Narain Raina, Former Judge Punjab and Haryana High Court; Mr. Anil Malhotra, Advocate, Punjab and Haryana High Court; and Dr. Deepak Jindal



Advocate, Punjab and Haryana High Court. The valedictory session began with Mr. Preetam Surana, Academic Head of Surana and Surana International Attorneys, welcoming the dignitaries. Hon'ble Justice Rajiv Narain Raina delivered his insightful comments on the theme of the moot. Mr. Anil Malhotra, in his erudite address, gave valuable suggestions to students to gain expertise in Advocacy skills. Moreover, as what Dr. Deepak Jindal in consonance with the other judges of the competition put it: "The best advocate is the one who submits his arguments with a smile on face." In the end, Hon'ble Justice Rajiv Narain Raina announced the Winners of the competition along with his parting words. V.I.T. School of Law, Chennai emerged as winners of the competition. The prizes were announced by Mr. Preetam Surana. The valuable support of the student members of the Organizing Committee was much appreciated, who tirelessly, coordinated from different parts of the country.

INTRA INSTITUTE MOOT COURT COMPETITION, 2021

The Intra Institute Moot Court Competition is an annual event at the Army Institute of Law in which the students from all batches are pitted against each other, fighting for the ultimate title. After tough scrutiny of the memorials, eight out of the fifteen teams qualified for the Quarter-Final rounds. The Quarter-final rounds were judged by members of the AIL faculty. After a round backed by fierce arguments and tough competition, four teams, TC-03, TC-06, TC-07, and TC-13 aced their way to the Semi-Finals. Two teams advanced to the final battle, which took place on 6th May 2021. The final tussle took place between TC-03 (Dilisha Nair & Yuvraj Singh) and TC-13 (Kanishka Chopra & Tanvi Garg). This round was judged by Mr. Mandeep

Mittal, Additional and Session Judge cum additional Member Secretary Punjab State Legal Services Authority, Mohali; Mrs. Iram Hasan Additional Civil Judge (Senior Division) cum Judicial Magistrate, Panchkula; and Dr. Shiva Satish Sharda, Assistant Professor of Law, Rajiv Gandhi National University of Law, Patiala.

The results of the competition were announced in the presence of Dr. Tejinder Kaur, Principal, AIL and other faculty members. TC-03 comprising Dilisha Nair (1749) and Yuvraj Singh (1747) from 4th year, was declared the best team. They won a cash prize of Rs. 4000. TC - 13, the runners-up team comprising Kanishka Chopra and Tanvi Garg (1st year), was awarded a cash prize of Rs. 3000. Dilisha Nair (1749)



from 4th year was declared the “Best Student Advocate” of the Competition and won a cash prize of Rs. 1000 for the same. The best memorial title was bagged by TC-6 comprising Harmanpreet Kaur (2043) and Kumari Kanchan (2034) from 1st year, who were awarded Rs. 2000; and the second-best memorial along with a reward of Rs. 1000 was bagged by Dilisha Nair (1749) and Yuvraj Singh (1747) from 4th year. The webinar had an impressive panel of Mr. Shonee Kapoor and Mr. Amit Deshpande. Mr. Shonee Kapoor is a legal evangelist with Tripaksha. He handles cases related to Section 498A IPC, domestic violence, divorce, annulment, adultery, maintenance and child custody. A warrior of the labyrinth of Indian matrimonial system, he also provides counselling to people suffering adversely from the Indian matrimonial laws. Mr. Amit Deshpande is a men's rights activist from Mumbai and has been involved in social activism for the past 7 years.

He is one of the founders of Vaastav Foundation, an organisation one of its kind, that focuses on the well-being of boys and men. The session was moderated by Ms. Shweta Nair, fourth year student of AIL. Also present in the session were Dr. Sheetal Kapoor and Dr. Amrita Rathi, faculty coordinator and co-coordinator, ABHAYAM.


Webinar on “Research Methodology”





First AIL Intra-Institute Judgment Analysis Competition, 2021




The Centre for Research in Constitutional Law & Policy (CRCLP), has been created with the objective to promote research and discourse in Constitutional Law and Policy. It aims to work towards critical analysis of the developments in Law from the perspective of Constitutionality through research and discussions; and provide a platform to the students to bring forth their ideas on matters pertaining to constitutional law with the aid of discussions, research pursuits, competitions and various other activities.

CRCLP conducted the first AIL Intra-Institute Judgment Analysis Competition. For a student of law,

analysing a Judgement is of vital importance. There are various parameters based on which the decision and the opinion of the Court in a Judgement are demarcated and analysed. A judgement has a history, a present situation of facts in hand and a future which it beholds. It affects the society and the laws of the country. This Competition aimed towards tapping the skills of the students of Army Institute of Law, Mohali towards the practice of critically analysing Judgements from the perspective of the Constitution of India, which is often referred to as the “grund norm”. The Judgement to be analysed was Indian Young Lawyers Association v. State of Kerala, 2018 SCC OnLine SC 1690, that is, the Sabrimala Temple case. The competition received an overwhelming response. Tanvir Sekhon (2002) of the 1st year bagged the first position and won a certificate of merit and cash prize of Rs. 2000; and Akshay Rathore (1959) of the 2nd year was declared the runner-up and was awarded a certificate of merit along with a cash prize of Rs. 1000.

Second Online Constitutional Law Lecture on “Goods and Service Tax - A Constitutional Perspective”



respected members of the faculty and students from various batches. The lecture commenced with an explanation about the situation existent prior to the coming of GST and the 101st Amendment of the Indian Constitution. The speaker explained how there was a difficulty in sharing taxes between the centre and the states resulting in a trust deficit. To resolve this issue the 80th Constitutional Amendment came into force in 2000. Then the working mechanism of GST was discussed in detail, with special emphasis on Articles 246A, 270 and 271 of the Constitution, and the functioning of the GST Council, was also discussed. The lecture was an insightful learning experience with respect to the working and functioning of the GST regime in the Indian Constitutional framework.

The Centre for Research in Constitutional Law and Policy (CRCLP) organized its second Online Constitutional Law Lecture on 12th April 2021 by Mr. Amrinder Singh on the interesting topic of “Goods and Service Tax- A Constitutional Perspective”. 

It was a very enriching learning experience for the students.
