





COMMENCEMENT OF THE SESSION

The new session at Army Institute of Law, Mohali commenced with great zeal and enthusiasm on the 5th of July for the 3rd, 4th, and 5th years. While for the 2nd year students, the session began on 16 September.

The new session is being carried out through the virtual mode for the time being. The students, faculty, and staff of AIL have exuded immense resolve in the past one and a half years by acclimatizing to the online mode of classes. The induction program will be held in the month of October. Center for Research in Corporate Law and Governance (CRCLG) successfully organised its first webinar for the academic session 2021-22, on "Auction of Coal Mines viz a viz Supreme Court of India: Developments after 2014", by Mr. Rohit Sharma, Associate Partner, Economic Laws Practice- ELP.

The speaker informed about the coal auction and then discussed that the principal legislation that formed the basic framework to regulate the mining sector in India. He informed that initially, the principal legislation in the country that

governed all the mining-related activities was the Mines and Mineral (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957. He told the students that the MMDR Act regulates the overall mining sector in India and that it promoted ease of doing business in the country.

He discussed the gaps and the effect of the landmarks judgment of ML Sharma that paved the way for amendments in the law relating to coal mines and their auction. He also discussed very briefly the Mineral Laws (Amendment) Act, 2020 which amended the previous Mines & Mineral (Development and Regulation) Act, 1957, and the Coal Mines (Special Provisions) Act, 2015.

It was a very informative session. The powerpoint presentation made by the speaker was quite good and useful for the students. The students seem to be benefitted as it is a potential field of litigation where students can venture. It was successfully conducted.

Center for Research in Constitutional Law and Policy (CRCLP) successfully organised a webinar for the academic session 2021-22, on “Juxtaposing Constitutional Guarantees with Customary Succession Laws”, Dr. Gitanjali Ghosh, Assistant Professor of Law, National Law University and Judicial Academy, Assam.

Dr. Gitanjali Ghosh is engaged in the teaching the core courses of International Law, Family Law, and Human Rights Law, at both undergraduate and postgraduate levels. She is also a member of the IUCN World Commission

of Environmental Law; and has authored a book on ‘De-constructing Inheritance Rights of Women under Tribal Customary Laws: A Comparative Study of Khasi and Mizo Tribes.’

The lecture began with a detailed analysis of the interpretation of Articles 13 and 14 of the Indian Constitution, from the perspective of personal laws. With an intriguing insight into the various conflicting judgments of various High courts across the country, the lecture moved onto the question of whether the personal laws fall under the definition of the term ‘law’ under Article 13. The lecture also dealt with the question at hand with respect to the States which have been granted special status under Article 371(g) of the Indian Constitution. Discussing landmark judgments like the State v. Narasu Appa Mali (AIR 1952 Bom 84), Madhu Kishwar v. the State of Bihar (AIR 1996 SC 1864), among others, the lecture ended with a deeper understanding of the dichotomy in the judicial approach in this area of law. The extremely insightful lecture was followed by riveting and diverse questions from the audience, making the session lively and interactive.

LEGAL READER

A maxim is a rule or saying or a principle that has to be followed by society. Maxims are used in various branches of law to make a particular point to understand clearly and provide a proper solution to the case. Maxims are widely used in the Law of Torts. In this section, we will understand five different Legal Maxims.

Ubi jus ibi remedium

Meaning: Where there is a right, there is a remedy.

If any wrong is committed then the law provides a remedy for that. The maxim can be phrased as that any person will not suffer a wrong without a remedy, it means that once it is proved that the right was breached then equity will provide a suitable remedy.

Ex turpi causa non-oritur

Meaning: From a dishonourable cause, an action does not arise.

This maxim is a Latin phrase which means that the plaintiff will not be able to recover damages if it arises having a connection with illegal activity.

Actio personalis moritur cum persona

Meaning: A personal right of action dies with a person.

This maxim means that the actions of torts are destroyed by the death of injured or the injured party. The cases cannot be passed over to the next person, other than the person himself. Besides this, an action may be brought by the personal representatives of the deceased.


Res Ipsa Loquitor

Meaning: Things speak for itself

Res ipsa loquitor is used in the cases of negligence, where proper evidence is not stated, but the facts are enough to decipher the negligence and prove the defendant guilty.
